



THE COSMIC CONTRAST (Part 2)

Text: Romans 5:15-17

Central Truth: God's grace extended through Jesus totally overcomes what Adam had done.

vv.12-14 I. Adam: Introduced Sin and Death into the World

vv.15-17 I. Jesus: Initiated Salvation and Life into the World

Three Main Contrasts Between Adam and Jesus:

v.15 1. Adam's (Trespass) – Jesus' (Free Gift)

NASB – **transgression**, KJV – **offense**, NIV & CSB – **trespass** (Greek – *paraptoma*) Literally to fall beside; it means to make a false step. It is deviating from the right path.

Free gift (Greek – charisma) This stresses something freely given to us that we could never earn or deserve. **The gift** (Greek – *dorea*)

v.16 2. Adam (Condemnation) – Jesus (Justification)

v.17 3. Adam (Death) – Jesus (Life)
